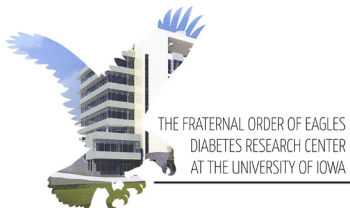

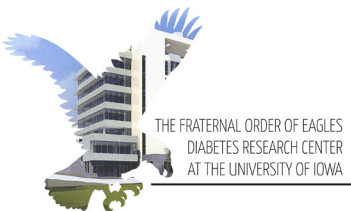
The World Health Organization reports that more than 220 million people worldwide (6% of the adult population) currently suffer from diabetes.

making history

In the summer of 2008, more than 700 Fraternal Order of Eagles delegates unanimously voted to pledge \$25 million over five years to the University of Iowa to fund The Fraternal Order of Eagles Diabetes Research Center. Since that day, the organization has been heavily committed to helping in the quest to cure diabetes.

All funds donated by the Eagles will be put directly toward research within the facility. \$15 million will be placed in endowments used to fund researchers and research programs in the facility while \$10 million in non-endowed funds will be used to help recruit leaders in the field of diabetes science and translational medicine.

Call it a mother's instinct. From the moment Kathy Christ arrived to pick up her nine-year-old daughter Amanda after a two-week stay with her father, she knew something was wrong. She was thinner, with her hips, ribs and shoulder blades protruding out of a frame that once appeared perfectly healthy.

“I was shocked,” Christ said. “Once we returned home, I made an appointment with the family doctor. A couple days later, I received a telephone call at work. It was the doctor and he wanted me to bring Amanda into the office immediately. They did a urinalysis at the office and the doctor came back into the room with the terrible news that Amanda was in ketoacidosis.”

Amanda had Type-I diabetes. She began on four shots of insulin per day and had to test her blood sugar 6-8 times per day. It wasn't a normal life - but it never would be living with diabetes.

The people around Amanda suddenly changed – frightened by the thought of what could happen in her presence. “Amanda's babysitter didn't want to take care of her anymore after she was diagnosed,” Christ said. “Some of her friends at school no longer wanted to play with her or invite her to birthday parties.”
