

Top Speakers, Big Name Entertainers And Multitude of Features Are Set For '79 Convention at Kansas City

JUST ABOUT everything is set — with top drawer speakers and big name entertainers ready — for the 1979 Grand Aerie Convention in Kansas City, Mo., on July 31-Aug. 1, 2, 3.

The Radisson-Muehlebach Hotel will be the Grand Aerie Headquarters, with sessions held there, while the Auxiliary will convene in the Presidents Hotel.

Leading speakers include Paul Harvey, the renowned newscaster; Terence Cardinal Cooke, archbishop of New York; Dr. Norman Vincent Peale, famed clergyman-author-lecturer; and others whose appearances are not yet firmed.

Cardinal Cooke will be the conclave's keynote speaker, while Harvey will deliver the principal address at the Convention Banquet on Wednesday evening, Aug. 1. Dr. Peale will give his usual inspirational message at the pre-Convention entertainment feature on Monday evening, July 30.

Nightly attractions include some of America's best known entertainers, headed by world-famed Bob Hope, and including George Gobel, Kaye Stevens, Connie Stevens and Corbett Monica already booked.

Gobel will appear on the Monday night show, along with Connie Stevens.

On Tuesday night the traditional Sports Banquet will be held, with former Ohio State football coach Woody Hayes heading a slate of speakers that include some of the biggest stars in sports history. Maury Splain, as usual, is directing, and will emcee, it.

Hope will convulse the audience, as always, at the Convention Banquet on Wednesday evening, while the show on Thursday night offers Kaye Stevens and Monica.

The Parade of Champions, the Convention Prayer Breakfast and, of course, the Installation of new Grand Aerie and Grand Auxiliary officers are also popular attractions. They will be held, respectively, on Thursday evening, Friday morning and Friday evening.

REAC will hold its own get-together on Thursday noon at the Continental Hotel Ballroom, featuring a luncheon, entertainment and other attractions.

\$26,645 Prize Pot Set For Convention Contests

A PRIZE POT of \$26,645 is awaiting top competing units in drill and ritualistic competition at the 1979 Grand Aerie Convention, and to units in the Convention Parade on Friday, Aug. 3.

Winners in the Ritualistic and Drill events will share \$15,970, and top units in the parade will split up \$10,675.

In addition, a bonus of \$100 will go to any band, drum and bugle corps or drum corps in the Parade that is certified as being composed entirely of Aerie and/or Auxiliary members.

A record entry list in both competitions is expected.

Alaska

Proceeds from the Auxiliary's event will be used for an upcoming surgery to remove Madelyn's legs below the knees. Her mother is a Past Madam President of Shelbyville #766. The Eagles also raised \$1,835 for Anna's Celebration of Life Foundation to donate in Madelyn's honor.




